

Lauren Romito received quite an honor yesterday. *Newsday* has named her one of the "25 Girls Basketball Players to Watch in 2018-19."


Lauren was described as follows in *Newsday*, "Lauren Romito is a post player who blocks shots and plays stellar defense for the defending Suffolk Class A Champs."


