


In addition to helping in their school, the Varsity Club contributes to camp and college scholarships, local and national charities and helps in providing better equipment for our sports teams.

From there, they will make recommendations as individual committees and come back to the full committee with those recommendations.

Dr. Donald Murphy, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction and Technology, started off the meeting with an introduction which included snacks, coffee and a quick "ice-breaker." Members of the committee were given color-coded name badges in order to easily separate them into groups. Once the groups formed, they answered "ice-breaker" questions to get to know each other.

- the Students


The goals of the committee are to:

Our Hauppauge Curriculum Committee in action was a wonderful thing to see!








## HAUPPAUGE HIGH SCHOOL JUNIOR ATTAINS EAGLE SCOUT RANK!

For his Eagle Scout Project, Ryan constructed benches and a garden at the Hauppauge Middle School. Congratulations Ryan on this well-deserved achievement!








