
On Thursday, May 2nd, the following students were honored for their participation in the High School Women in Science and Engineering (WISE) Program at Stony Book University.

Dr. Probst shared some interesting statistics about this very accomplished group:

- These 27 students represent the top 10% of their graduating class.
- These students submitted 220 college applications and received 151 acceptances to over 80 colleges
- and universities.
- They took the SAT and ACT a combined total of 90 times.
- They took 54 SAT subject tests.
- During their time in High School these students took a total of 239 honors courses, 152 AP courses, and 242 IB courses.

In closing, Dr. Probst said, "Congratulations to the students, their families, to HS Principal, Chris Cook, the administration, faculty, and staff at the HS and to all the educators, K-12, who worked with these students over the years. Seniors, as you head off to these great colleges and universities, show them what it means to be from Hauppauge!"

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS NOMINATED FOR PRESTIGIOUS DRAMA AWARD

High School students, Emma Casey and Vincent Gerardi have been nominated for the Roger Rees Awards in NYC for their roles in the High School production of "Twelfth Night." Ruthie Pincus, Theater Educator said, "This is a prestigious honor and scores are calculated by adjudicators who came to see our show. They will be required to compete among other high school students in the New York area in a couple of weeks and have the opportunity of competing for scholarships to colleges in the field of theatre and a national competition called the 'Jimmys'."

The Roger Rees Awards for Excellence in Student Performance is presented by Disney Theatrical Group (The Broadway League member) and the Broadway Education Alliance (Roger Rees Awards fiscal sponsor) in association with Camp Broadway LLC who serves as the program administrator and showcase producer. It is currently the only student award in the New York metro area that recognizes distinction in student performance and outstanding achievement in high school musical theatre programs. The program is funded through donations from industry professionals, foundations, licensing companies and other individuals or companies who are committed to supporting performing arts programs in area schools. The Roger Rees Awards (RRA) is the Greater New York



Regional Award program of The Broadway League Foundation's, The Jimmy® Awards, aka The National High School Musical Theatre Awards® (NHSMTA®).
