

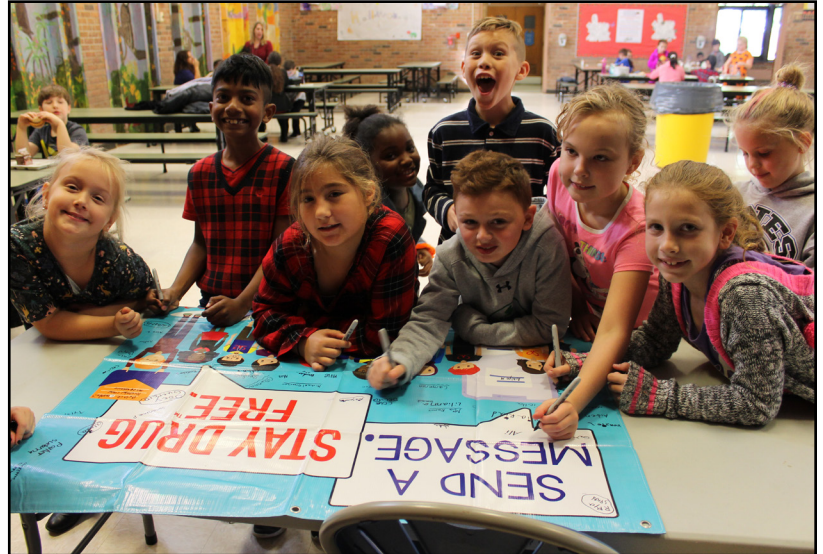
PINES STUDENTS CELEBRATE “RED RIBBON WEEK” AND PLEDGE TO “STAY DRUG FREE”

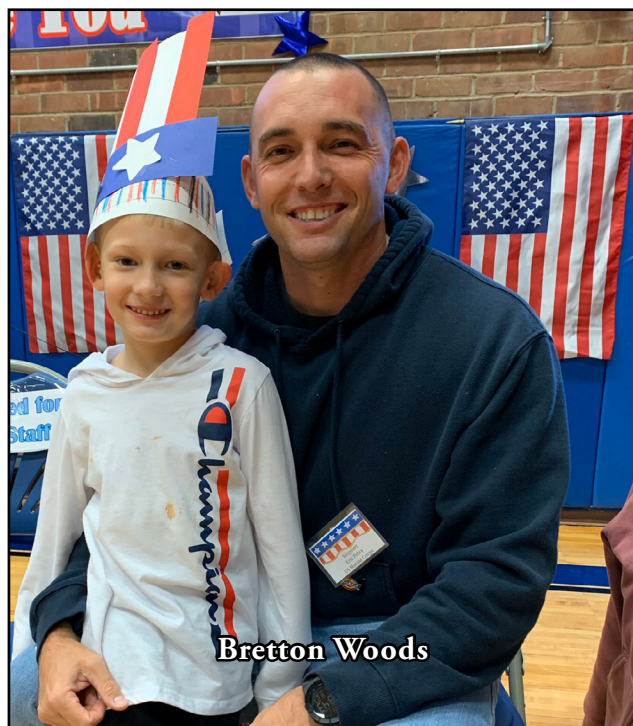
OUR ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS HONOR OUR VETERANS

Veterans Day is a day that is set aside to honor our military veterans for their service to our country. It is a day that we salute our heroes for the sacrifices they have made for our nation.

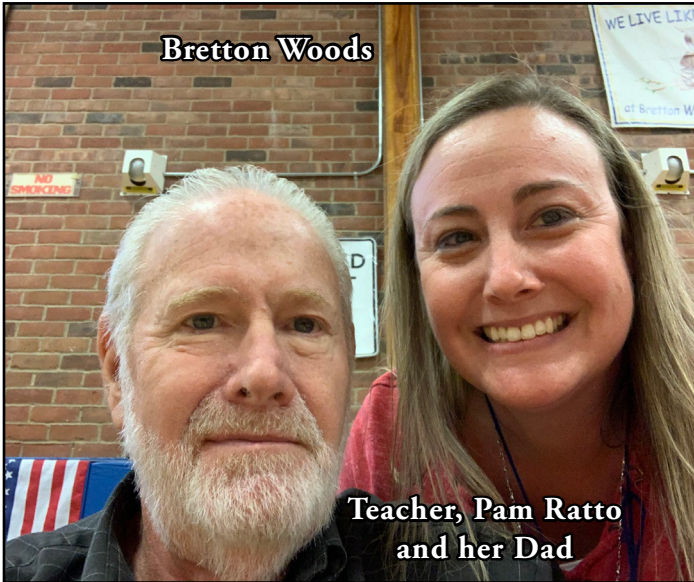

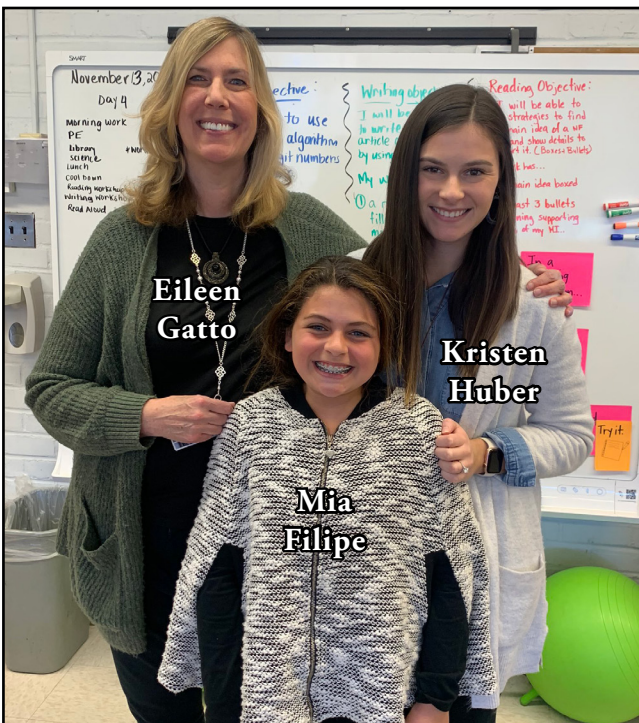
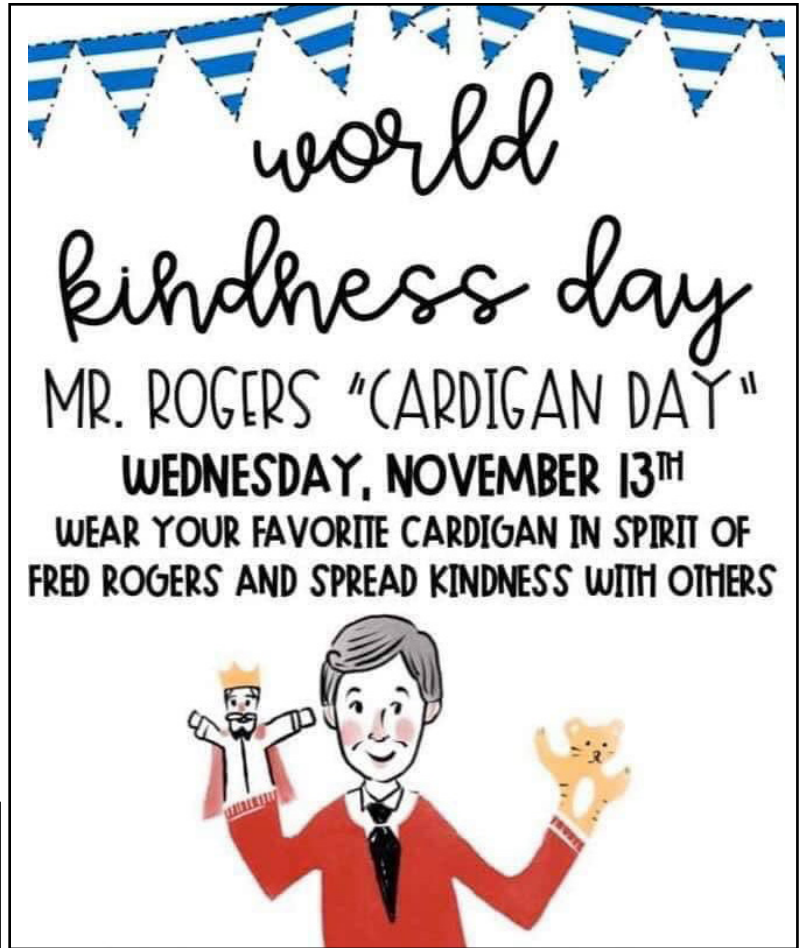

STORIES CAME ALIVE AT RECENT BRETTON WOODS ASSEMBLY

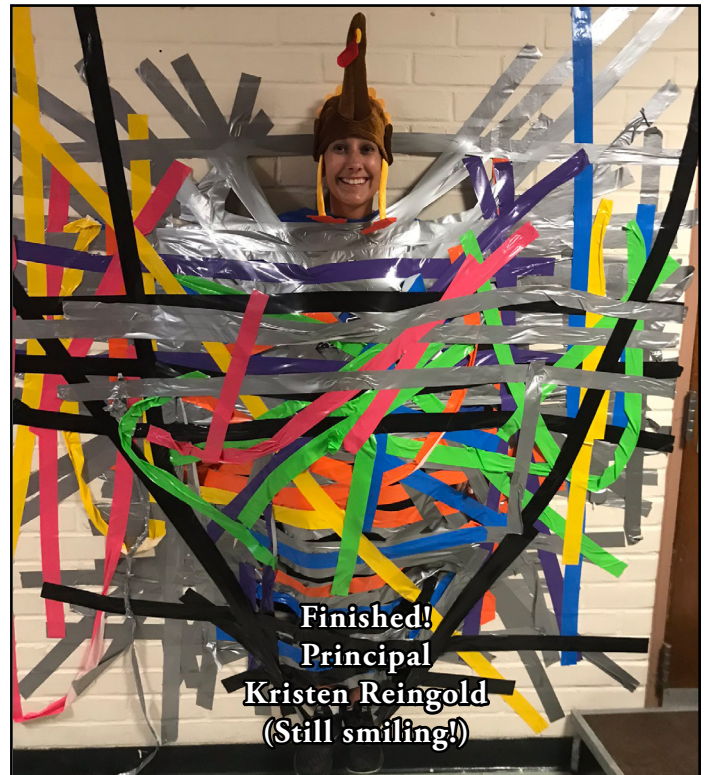
“StoryFaces”

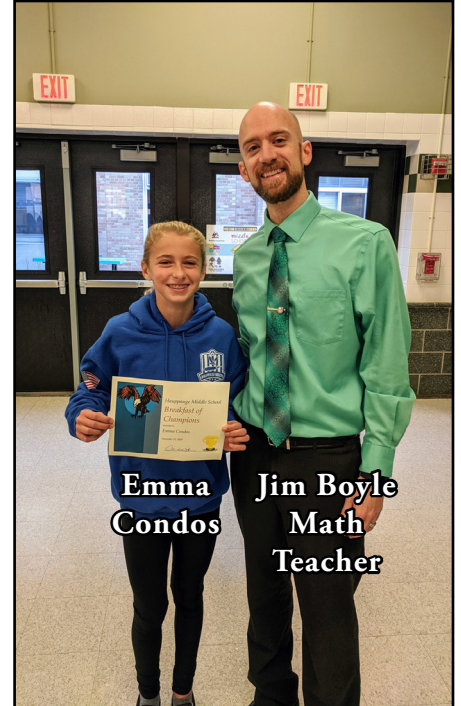

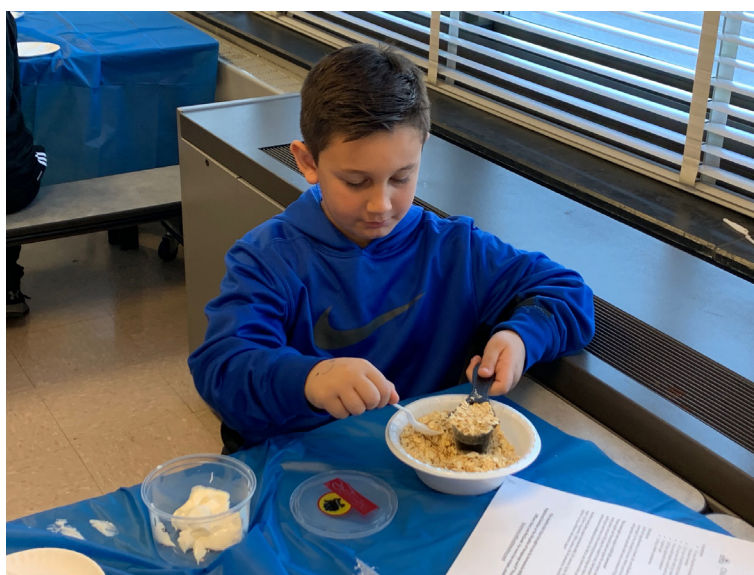
FOREST BROOK STUDENTS GET EDUCATED ON HEALTHY COOKING AND MEAL PLANNING

Recently various members of the United States Army came to the high school in order to recognize a special member of our community for their commitment to support our military.

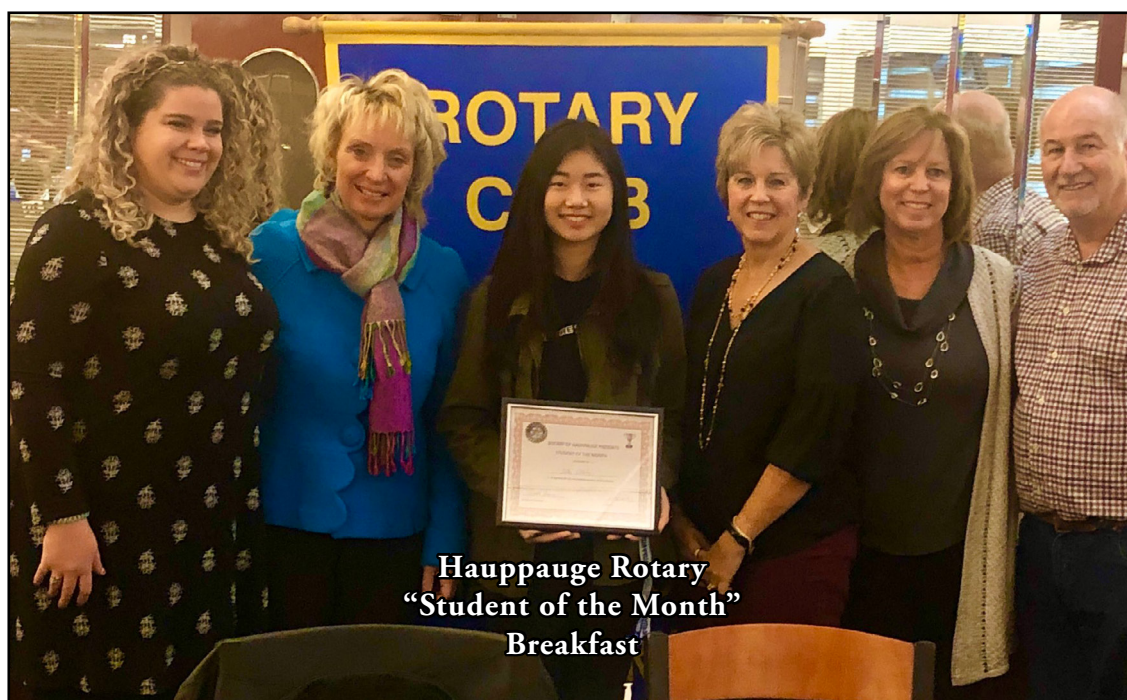
High School Assistant Principal, Joy Ferrara, received a plaque recognizing her “for her boundless support of the Suffolk County Army Recruiting Company.”

BRETTON WOODS, FOREST BROOK AND PINES 4TH & 5TH GRADERS HAVE A “BOOK CHAT”

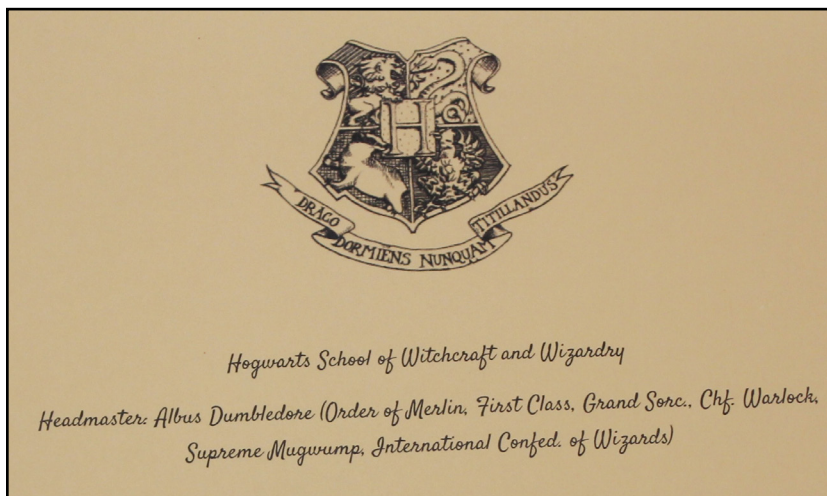
