
# FOREST BROOK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CELEBRATES RED RIBBON WEEK

This year's theme is "Send a Message; Stay Drug Free." Through participation in the week's meaningful messages and educational activities, students showed their support in saying "NO"












## HAUPPAUGE SCHOOL'S SHINING "STAR" IS BACK FROM THE 2019 GLOBAL GAMES IN BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA WITH NUMEROUS MEDALS IN HAND

Starlette Menendez, Hauppauge's shining "Star" has returned from the 2019 Global Games in Brisbane, Australia. Starlette ran four races and took home a Silver medal in three out of her four races, the 100m, 200m and 400m, setting a personal record in all of her races!

As you may recall from a previous article, Starlette is the first and only athlete with Down Syndrome to represent the USA. Over 50 countries and 1,000 athletes were represented at these games which are the world's biggest elite sports event for athletes with intellectual impairments. Star-



lette represented New York in Track and Field events alongside three other U.S. athletes from California, Minnesota and Wisconsin. Also on the USA team with Starlette was swimmer, Jacob Basini who is also a Hauppauge graduate.

Starlette's mother, Deena, shared, "Not only did she excel on the track, but she was able to reside the entire week in the 'athlete village' with her team. She was really able to be an independent successful athlete."

on Tuesday. When asked about her flight, Starlette said it was long! There were actually two flights she had to take; one from New York to Los Angeles and then from Los Angeles to Australia.

When Starlette arrived in Australia at the Games, she met her coach, Coach Scott. She also met her roommate, Lauren, who is a swimmer on the USA Team and comes from Orlando, FL.

Starlette ran her races on different days throughout her time in Australia and was able to practice and train in between. But, it wasn't all work and she said they went on an excursion to the Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary where she was able to actually hold a Koala bear, as well as see lots of reptiles and animals local to Australia. Starlette also said that she was able to be a spectator at some of the events including the Shot Put, 500m race and some of her roommate, Lauren's races.

Starlette already has her eye on next year's Global Games. When asked her if she would like to compete again, she said she would. She hopes to be a part of next year's Team USA and travel to, as she said it the "City of Love" in Paris, France!

# HAUPPAUGE'S ANDRIANA ZAPHIRIS EARNS SPOT IN THE NEW YORK STATE GIRLS TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Andriana Zaphiris has been Hauppauge's number one tennis player for the past four years. Earning All-County honors in three of the four, last year due to an injury, she was forced to miss the Suffolk County tournament. To date, she has been undefeated in dual meets for the past three years and has accumulated over seventy varsity wins. She has been the Hauppauge team "Most Valuable Player" for the past four years.

This past weekend, Andriana Zaphiris, a Hauppauge Junior, placed third in the Suffolk County Girls Tennis Tournament clinching a spot in the singles New York State tournament held in Latham, NY on November 2nd. Andriana, seeded sixth in the Section Tournament won her first-round match, 6-0, 6-0 over Nora Sacco from Bayshore and followed it with a 6-0, 6-1, win over Aislin Riccardelli from Bayport. In her quarterfinal match she faced the number three seed Gabriella Glickstein, from Commack, one of Suffolk County's best singles players. Losing the first set 6-1, Andriana fought back to even the score with a 6-0 2nd set win. Glickstein jumped to a third set 5-1 lead before Andriana started an unbelievable come-back. Head Coach Chris Messina has seen it before and knew "She was not going to quit. Digging down deep she took it one game at a time winning the final set 7-5 and earning a trip to the semi-finals after a 45 minute break."

In the semi's Andriana faced the Division one champ and second seed Kady Tannenbaum, also from Commack. She jumped out to an early lead winning the first set, 6-3. Tannenbaum struck back winning the second set, 6-4 and finished with a 7-5, 3rd set win moving on to the finals. In the consolation match for 3rd and 4th, a win qualified Andriana for a spot on the New York State Tennis team. Andriana defeated Andrea Brazyte, 6-3, 6-2 from Connetquot and will represent Hauppauge up at the States in two weeks.


On a beautiful morning this past Monday, the students set out on the Yankee III Charter Boat on the Great South Bay so that

they could compare the creatures they found out on the South Shore. The students made their own plankton nets and seined. Seine fishing is a method of fishing that employs a fishing net called a seine that hangs vertically in the water with its mottom edge held down by weights



and its top edge buoyed by floats. The crew also used plankton nets and a dredge to bring up boty phytoplankton and benthic samples.








## "SAY IT, FIGHT IT, CURE IT! COURTNEY TOMKIN, FOREVER IN OUR HEARTS!"

Hauppauge High School recently held on October 18th, a very special fundraiser that is dear to their hearts. "Kicks for Cancer" began at Hauppauge High School in 2008 as a way to honor and support Hauppauge HS student, Courtney Tomkin, a Junior who was diagnosed with brain cancer the previous Spring. The summer after Courtney was diagnosed, Hauppauge Girls Varsity Soccer Goalkeeper, Alexis Gonzalez, went to Jesseca Kulesa, her coach, asking how the team could put something together to help Courtney and her family. It was during that conversation that "Kicks for Cancer" was born.





"That fall, she ran out onto the field facing an uphill battle. You wouldn't have guessed by the big smile on her face as she greeted her teammates in the middle of the field. It was the day her friends and this community stood by her side and developed "Kicks for Cancer". This community was a place she loved to call her home. "Kicks for Cancer" meant the world to Courtney and to us, her family. Courtney was brave and courageous beyond her years and she knew that her time here was going to be cut short. We are all put to Earth for our lifetime for however many years it is. For Courtney it was a life that had hardly begun, but that's not how she described it. For Courtney it "was 17 great years". Our daughter, your sister, your friend, your student, taught us to look at the world through better eyes, to take time to enjoy life's simple joys. She set about creating special and memorable moments. She made every day count. "Kick's for Cancer" allowed her to see just how much love she was going to take with her. Courtney's life ended on December 13th, 2008, but she left us a lifetime of fond moments, precious memories and so much love. Our life as a family will be forever changed and our hearts broken for having lost a daughter and a sister as special as Courtney. We take pride in knowing however, that her life meant something to all of you who share in this event. So we wish to thank you for making this event in honor of Courtney, and for loving her and missing her as much as we do. Courtney was so proud of the Hauppauge Girls Varsity Soccer Team. Their love, generosity and friendship were unbelievable and meant the world to her. We hope that Kicks for Cancer continues to grow, that the proceeds will benefit other children suffering the terrible tragedy of Cancer, and that someday this charitable event will help in finding a cure."


