Congratulations, Emma! We look forward to your continued success in the program.




### LONG ISLAND SCHOLAR ARTIST, VINCENT GERARDI, IS FEATURED IN NEWSDAY


Mr. Cook's office mural is divided into sections that tell the story of the learning that goes on in the school. The sections are:


Amanda said, "Being a part of this group has given us meaning and we want to continue to make a difference. We have more to beautify!" We look forward to seeing more murals from this talented group!
























# BRETTON WOODS TEACHER IS NAMED HAUPPAUGE PATCH "TEACHER OF THE WEEK"

#### VARSITY BOYS SWIM TEAM CONTINUES TO ACHIEVE

The Varsity Boys Swim Team has continued to achieve with some very impressive accomplishments!

Sean Napolitano, Michael Seda, Jake DiVilio, Vincent Reino, Jake Nielsen, Michael Schroeder and Marcus Ballerini received the "Sportsmanship Award" for Section XI Boys Swimming at their County meet. Boys Varsity Swimming placed 2nd, out of 8, in their League Championship meet as they headed into Counties.

At the County Meet at Stony Brook University, Sean Napolitano, Michael Seda, Jake DiVilio, Vincent Reino, Jake Nielsen, Marcus Ballerini, along with Colin Buscarino, diver, represented Hauppauge. Colin Buscarino, first year diver for Hauppauge, finished 4th in the County. Out of the 12 events in this swim meet, Hauppauge had qualified swimmers in all, but entered athletes into 10 events. Of the 10 events entered, all athletes placed and scored for the Hauppauge Team. Also, all athletes achieved personal records in at least one of their events, if not more.

Hauppauge Varsity Swim placed 4th in the County, but first in small school (League 1). Vincent Reino, Jake Neilsen, Sean Napolitano, Marcus Ballerini and Michael Schroeder are All-County Swimmers; Vincent Reino (200 Medley Relay and 100 Backstroke), Jake Nielsen (200 Medley Relay, 200 Individual Medley, 100 Breaststroke), Michael Schroder (200 Medley Relay, 100 Butterfly, 100 Backstroke), and Sean Napolitano (100 Medley Relay). All qualified to go onto States.
