# MIDDLE SCHOOL "GOLDEN EAGLES" EARN TOP SPOT AT "THIRD ANNUAL LONG ISLAND JUNIOR HACKATHON"

On Friday March 12, the Hauppauge Middle School "Golden Eagles" team competed in the "Third Annual Long Island Jr. Hackathon" hosted by KidOYO, finishing as the top school from Suffolk County and tied for 4th place overall. Captain, Srihan Adibala (grade 8), led the team; a combination of in-person and virtual students, that included:

The team was supported and trained by Head Coach, Brian Ferrara, and Assistant Coaches, Amy Thompson and Maryann Mullen. Utilizing their skills in the Python, Scratch, and Piskel coding languages, the team needed to win territories on a map to earn points (similar to a game of risk), by creating programs and projects that met specified criteria. This year's map had a "Samurai" theme, and called upon teams to research and display their knowledge of Japanese history and customs while creating fun games, graphics, and online tools that fit the theme.

Over 600 programs were created during the three-hour competition in an attempt to control each of the 30 territories. The "Golden Eagles" controlled 5 territories at the end of competition, behind the strength of Brandon Cardamone's fun soccer simulator in Hatch, Sara Conquet's beautiful Cherry Blossom pixel art in Sprite Editor,

and Srihan Adabala's impressive "Last Samurai" python project. The team also took home an award for the "Best Theme for a Capital Defense Project".

To win this award, Hauppauge's coders, together as a team, created a website that took visitors through the seven principles of the bushido code with mini-games that focused on each principle contributed by each team member. The judges determined that Hauppauge's website "Went beyond just creating a project, but they bought into the theme and the map and the historical context in a unique way."

Head coach, Brian Ferrara said of the team, "We are extremely proud of this group and their growth not only in preparing for the competition this year, but also throughout their middle school careers. As sixth graders, many of these team members completed and finished in 8th place out of 10 teams. Last year, many returned and improved to 5th place. So to see them cap off their middle school coding career by continuing that upward trajectory is very special. They showed grit, tenacity, teamwork, and coding precision in a very fast-paced environment. All of these students have bright careers ahead of them and should be very proud of themselves for working so hard and elevating Hauppauge the way they have. It is nice to be mentioned as one of the premier schools on Long Island when it comes to coding. That is all thanks to students like these and the administrators here at Hauppauge that provide the opportunity to all students in the district to learn to code."



Typically the teams would meet at a central location, but this year marked the first time the inter-district coding competition was conducted in a completely virtual setting, connecting 16 teams from Nassau and Suffolk county with the help of Zoom. It was also broadcast live on YouTube. Coders throughout the district will be competing in similar upcoming events, as the Senior Hackathon for High School teams will be held on April 9th (coached by Frank Hufnagel) and the Upper Elementary Hackathon (for 6th grade students) will take place on April 30th (coached once again by Mr. Ferrara, Ms. Mullen, and Ms. Thompson).

We couldn't be prouder of the "Golden Eagles!" Congratulations on a great job and an impressive finish in the "Hackathon!"

On Wednesday, March 17th, schools across the map were invited through Vocabulary.com to compete in a special One-Day Vocabulary Bowl Challenge.

The word-learning action played out on the daily leaderboards for 24 hours as students mastered as many words as they could on Vocabulary.com by playing "The Challenge." This was a fast and furious event that brought some much needed fun to students, whether they were learning in school or remote.

The schools that mastered the most words on March 17th and finished at the top of the Division I, II, and III leader-boards were to be crowned the "March Madness Champions." # BRETTON WOODS STUDENTS "CHOOSE LOVE"

The Bretton Woods "Social Emotional Learning" Committee has introduced the "Choose Love for Schools" program. The "Jesse Lewis Choose Love Movement" was inspired by the bravery of a six year old boy and a mother's choice to forgive, and led to the creation of Next-Generation Social & Emotional Learning (SEL) and Character Development programming to create a safe, more loving world.

Scarlett Lewis founded the "Choose Love Movement" after her son, Jesse, was murdered during the Sandy Hook Elementary tragedy in December of 2012. Shortly after his death, Scarlett decided to become a part of the solution to the issues that we see in our society today-and that also caused the tragedy. She created this movement and became an advocate for character development and social and emotional learning, which teaches children how to manage their emotions, feel connected, and have healthy relationships.

Every child at Bretton Woods will experience a "Choose Love" lesson once per month over the next four months on the following dates. All students and staff can wear the same color on the day of the Choose Love Lesson:

March 15th - Courage, Everyone Wear RED April 12th - Gratitude, Everyone Wear GREEN May 17th - Forgiveness, Everyone Wear YELLOW June 15th - Compassion in Action, Everyone Wear PINK








#### HAUPPAUGE SCHOOLS TURN GREEN FOR ST. PATRICK'S DAY




