






# HIGH SCHOOL DANCERS GO "VIRTUAL" WITH THE BROADWAY DANCE CENTER




#### HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 2021 GETS BOOST FROM THEIR SENIOR CLASS PARENTS



### FIFTH-GRADE STUDENTS ENJOY INTERESTING SCIENCE CLASS ASSIGNMENT


Mrs. Lewkovich and Mrs. Gumbus' 5th grade classes dissected owl pellets during science class. Owl Pellets are regurgitated remains from an animal (fur and bones) in the form of a pellet. It is what the owl cannot digest.

The children were very excited to find out what kind of prey an owl has eaten and couldn't digest. Some children retrieved limbs, skulls, ribs, vertebrae, jaws, and other various bones that they glued to a diagram of small prey.
