



Congratulations to Michael and Jayleen, and to the entire class on a great job! Enjoy the party!!!






FOREST BROOK STUDENT IS WINNER OF "EARTH DAY POSTER CONTEST"

The Hauppauge girls tennis team finished the 2021 season as "League II Champions" and completed an undefeated season at 11-0. Leading the way for the Eagles were seniors and captains, Andriana Zapharis and Melody Cheng, both finishing at 11-0 in first and second singles respectively. Seniors Teresa Deasy and Elizabeth Holdorf led the team in first doubles. Junior Sophia Rosato added depth to the lineup finishing at 11-0 in her matches at third singles. Junior Heather McGullam stepping in at fourth singles finished her season at 8-2 and 1 tie. Doubles team of Riya and Roop Takhar completed a 9-2 season at second doubles while third doubles team of Samantha Fehrenbach and Riti Takhar also went 11-0 in league play.

"A total team effort enabled our girls to complete our first undefeated season in close to twenty



years" according to Coach Messina. "I was so proud of the way our team competed and played the entire season. Several times, although losing their first set in various individual matches they dug down deep and won the next two sets to clinch the victory. In the division tournament, although the girls played very competitive tennis, they lost some close



matches. Andriana Zapharis led the team once again and played in the finals on Monday, April 19th. Andriana has been an outstanding player for Hauppauge finishing her career match record at 54-1, and has over 75 wins adding in tournaments as well. She has been All-County for four years as well as All-State last year. Andriana has selected to go to Marist college on a tennis scholarship.

Melody Cheng won her first match 6-0, 6-0 and lost in the second round to Bella Spilatros from Smithtown West. In addition to being an outstanding tennis player, Melody's Academic achievements, have earned her the title of Valedictorian for the Hauppauge Class of 2021.

HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR IS RECIPIENT OF ART AWARD



NEWSDAY ARTICLE FEATURES FORMER HAUPPAUGE HIGH SCHOOL VALEDICTORIAN

Each year as part of Newsday's graduation coverage, the newspaper reaches out to some of Long Island's valedictorians from ten years earlier. Those students are covered in a special "Where Are They Now?" feature. This year, 2011 valedictorian, Lauren McGarry responded and she was included in this special article along with ten other high school valedictorians from across Long Island.



Lauren McGarry attended

Georgetown University after high school and today is a Senior English Language Arts Curriculum Designer at "IXL Learning." She lives in North Carolina. Here is an excerpt from her *Newsday* article written by Rachel Weiss and Erin Serpico.

"Ten years, Lauren McGarry dreamed of becoming a lexicographer. Now she says, 'Although I'm not making dictionaries, my actual job aligns pretty well with the goals I set in high school.' McGarry's goals changed throughout college. During her undergraduate years, she imagined herself researching the syntax of Slavic languages for the rest of her life. She studied linguistics and Russian, and spent some time working in neurology and developmental psychology research labs.

She credits her undergraduate adviser, Ruth Kramer, with fostering her passion for language during her junior and senior years. McGarry speaks French and Russian, plus a little bit of German. 'I fell in love with syntax because of how she taught it, and she spent a lot of time helping me pursue that interest,' McGarry said. But while in graduate school at the University of California Santa Cruz, she had a realization. 'I was much more interested in teaching than in doing research,' she said. 'I've been much happier working in education technology.'

McGarry has been working at IXL Learning for three years. The K-12 learning website is used by millions of students worldwide. In her role, McGarry helps develop their ELA content. S he credits her high school French and AP English teachers, Christine Rigaud and Ellen Ryan, with having an 'immense impact' on where she is today. 'They both helped me grow so much as a student and as a person,' McGarry said.

In her free time, McGarry volunteers at Carolina Tiger Rescue, a sanctuary for wild cats. She assists with their educational tours. She also just started taking cello lessons. 'Music gives me a sense of structure and helps clear my head - exactly what I needed to get through 2020' she said.

Looking back on her academic achievement, McGarry notes a valuable lesson she's learned in the past decade: 'There is not one singular, objective measure of intelligence or success,' she said."

We wish Lauren much success in her future endeavors!


PINES STAFF MEMBER IS RECOGNIZED FOR HER DEDICATION TO PINES STUDENTS

We could not ask for a more caring and very thoughtful coworker. We are grateful to have yet another Hauppauge staff member that is changing life trajectories.




HIGH SCHOOL DRAMA STUDENTS BRING "THE ADDAMS FAMILY" TO LIFE


PINES STUDENTS ENJOY A COMPETITIVE "STEAM" CLASS
