# SIXTH-GRADE "CODIN' EAGLES" PLACE FIRST AT UPPER ELEMENTARY HACKATHON


coached by Amy Thompson, Brian Ferrara, and Maryann Mullen, placed first in the inaugural "Upper Elementary Hackathon" hosted by *kidOYO*.

The Codin' Eagles fought a long battle against 14 other schools before being declared the winners. "The enthusiasm and teamwork of this team was inspirational. There was an excitement and commitment to winning from the beginning of the competition," said Doreen Gordon, Director of Social Studies and Business.

A "hackathon" is a coding competition that pits schools from around Long Island against each other in an attempt to utilize their skills in the *Python, Scratch,* and *Piskel* coding languages to win territories



on a map and earn points (similar to a game of *Risk*). They do this by creating programs and projects that meet specified criteria. The inaugural map had a "Monster" theme, which allowed students to show off their creativity while programming fun games, graphics, and online tools that fit the theme. Over 900 programs were created during the three-hour competition in an attempt to control each of the 47 territories. Hauppauge ended the day with 10 territories - three more than the next closest team.



The day started off quickly with Andrew Solomon getting Hauppauge off to an early lead with two imaginative sprite designs of a "monster under the bed" and a "centaur." The Codin' Eagles built on this lead with the help of a "Vampire Survival Game" and "Haunted House" project designed by JT Kogel, a digital advertisement for a "monster movie" and "scare-o-meter" program created by Akhil Grandhi, a "werewolf transformation animation" and a pixel art picture of *Shrek* drawn in *Python* by Samvath Karanam, an impressive "Find the Loch Ness Monster" game programmed by Maddie Mileo, and two "Monster Island Airship" simulators designed by Naisha Mundra and Andrew Solomon.

At halftime it was also announced that Hauppauge had earned two awards. The first was "Best Team Banner" for a design submitted by Naisha Mundra. The second was for "Best Team Capital De-



fense Project." To win this award, Hauppauge's coders, together as a team, created a website that took visitors aboard an "Airship" for a glimpse into "life inside as it escapes from Monster Island". Akhil Grandhi spearheaded the creation of the website, which featured the background story and a blueprint of the airship. By clicking on specific areas of the blueprint, the user was taken to interactive demonstrations or games depicting life on the ship, highlighted by team captain James Bohuslaw's "Monster Battle" from the weapons room and Louis Constante's "Fly the Ship to Safety" simulator, which could only be unlocked by compiling a secret code with numbers earned only by defeating all of the other games on the website. The website can be visited by clicking here: <a href="http://coolr.oyosite.com/monster-">http://coolr.oyosite.com/monster-</a> Coach Brian Ferrara said, "The Capital Defense Project was not only a fun and capitaldefense.html impressive website, but the creation of it showcased some of the best teamwork and leadership I've ever seen exhibited by sixth graders. The team took the project from concept to creation in 48 hours leading up to the Hackathon. During this time there were multiple Google Meet sessions, both run by the coaches and run independently by the team, as well as an introduction to an HTML session run by Akhil to teach his teammates how to embed their projects to the website. To say these kids deserved to win due to their hard work is an absolute understatement. I am so proud of them and happy for them to get to see it all pay off."

Coach Amy Thompson added, "Each one of these students showed real commitment and passion for coding. They were very happy to take part in the competition and be a Hauppauge Codin' Eagle. They put in countless hours of work and didn't give up. Many of the skills they used during the competition were self-taught. Each member of the Hauppauge Codin' Eagles brought their own skill set to the competition and rooted for each other. It was an amazing experience for us as coaches to watch these young coders work together to problem solve, to be creative, and to rise above our expectations. In an unusual and challenging year, it was awesome to see our team jumping and screaming in excitement as *kidOYO* declared Hauppauge the winner of the Upper Elementary Hackathon Competition!"


# HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR IS RECIPIENT OF AWARD FROM "AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY"






# HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ACHIEVE RANK OF EAGLE SCOUT

We would like to congratulate these students on this remarkable achievement. The list also includes students from the Class of 2020.




