



HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR IS A "COCA-COLA 2022 REGIONAL FINALIST"

Congratulations to high school senior, Varsha Saravanan! Varsha has been named a Regional Finalist in the "Coca-Cola Scholars Program!" She is one of 251 students across the country that have been named a Regional Finalist!

Making it to this level is a huge accomplishment as these students have progressed to the second stage of selection after the review of 1,617 Semifinalists who were chosen from among 68,000 applicants hoping to be named "Coca-Cola Scholars" this year. Varsha is one of 11 students chosen from New York; four of which are on Long Island.

These high school seniors have made it through an extremely competitive second stage of selection and are participating in regional interviews with a committee of Scholar Alumni and staff members. 

We salute Emma and Jessica for their hard work, and efforts to assist breast cancer patients. Here are some photos from the event.






February 5th, 2022 was a great day of wrestling at Hauppauge High School, which had 17 Varsity wrestlers competing in 13 weight classes. The Tournament hosted a total of 7 teams with 125 varsity wrestlers. Hauppauge came up a few points short right down to the last period of the 285 lb bout.

Coach Chris Messina said the following, "The boys did a terrific job. We did not expect to be in the running for the title, but several of our underclassmen, especially freshmen, came to wrestle and placed, giving the team a huge boost in points. Freshman, Connor Sheridan, won the league title at 102 lbs. He is on a short list of freshmen in the history of Hauppauge to win the league tournament his first year competing on the varsity team. The surprise came as freshman Gino Manta placed second to Connor and at 110 lbs. Freshman, Andrew DiBenedetto, placed fourth. Senior, Luke Clackett, avenged an earlier season loss to Billy Colloca from West Babylon by winning 5-0 in the finals. For his efforts, Luke was declared the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" by the coaches. Hauppauge sent five to the finals and came away with four championships. The tournament was decided by the last match of the night with Bellport's 285 lb wrestler earning a pin. Overall, we were happy the boys finishing in second, and now are getting ready for the Suffolk County Championships this weekend."




