


















HIGH SCHOOL FALL STUDENT ATHLETES MAKE THEIR COLLEGE COMMITMENTS

Shown here are a few members of Pines Student Council who designed a Food Train donation box which students filled to the brim with much needed food items. Way to go - Choo Choo!!






HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE CANDIDATES FOR THE LEUKEMIA AND LYMPHOMA SOCIETY'S "2022 STUDENTS OF THE YEAR CAMPAIGN"

High School students Reese Coughlin, Vivian Derby, and Avery Marchese, have been accepted as candidates in the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's "2022 Students of the Year Campaign!" Each student participating in the Long Island Chapter's annual scholarship and fundraising challenge was nominated for their amazing leadership, passion to find cures for cancer, and involvement in the community.

Students of the Year is a philanthropic leadership development program for exemplary high school students. During the campaign, participants foster professional skills such as entrepreneurship, marketing, and project management in order to raise funds for LLS. The title Student(s) of the Year is awarded to the candidate or co-candidates in each community that raise the most funds during the seven-week competition. The campaign starts on Thursday, February 3rd with a virtual Kickoff Celebration at 7:30 p.m. The campaign culminates with the Grand Finale Celebration on March 24th, 2022. The funds raised benefit the LLS mission: to find a cure for leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma, and to improve the quality of life of patients and their families.

Meaghan Neary, Campaign Development Director for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, said the following, "Last year, more than \$37.2 million was raised by high school students throughout the country for blood cancer research, patient aid, and community outreach programs. On Long Island alone, 26 candidate teams raised more than \$900,000. This is truly an elite group! We count ourselves lucky to have your students as a part of this campaign to represent Hauppauge High School."

On Friday, all fourth and fifth grade students




