THREE HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS ARE POISED TO BEGIN THEIR FUTURE MILITARY CAREERS AT SERVICE ACADEMIES

Three of our high school seniors have their eyes on a military career, and they are poised to begin this future military service as follows:







Melody Zhu was accepted to the United States Naval Academy, Annapolis. Students who wish to attend any of the military academies, must first receive either a Congressional or Senatorial nomination. Melody received both! Melody competed against other seniors in our Congressional District and NY State Senator Kirsten Gillibrand, and Congressman Lee Zeldin both granted the nomination to her.

Melody went through a series of interviews - with the Congressman's committee, Senator's committee, and the US Naval Academy's admission committee. Melody also had to go through a rigorous physical fitness assessment and medical evaluation as part of the admission process.

Melody will earn a 4 year Bachelors of Science Degree and be commissioned as an Ensign (or 2nd Lieutenant) in the Navy. The Navy pays 100% of the tuition, room & board and all health care associated with the 4 years. Tuition is valued at \$400,000.

Jack Rzepecki received a full NROTC scholarship to Penn State University. Selected applicants for the Navy ROTC Scholarship are awarded scholarships through a highly competitive national selection process. Jack was interviewed by a panel of active and retired Naval personnel and was selected to receive full tuition, books stipend, educational fees and other financial benefits. Upon graduation, Jack will be commissioned as an officer in the United States Navy. This honor is equivalent to a \$200,000 scholarship.

Kevin Holtje has received a Congressional Nomination from Congressman Lee Zeldin to attend the United States Military Academy at West Point. His acceptance is pending at this time.

HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR, VARSHA SARAVANAN, IS A "2022 COCA-COLA SCHOLAR"

HAUPPAUGE WRESTLERS COMPETE IN CHAMPIONSHIPS

High School Freshman, Connor Sheridan; Senior, Mikey Manta; and Junior, Frankie Volpe, all qualified for the "NYS Wrestling Championships" held this past weekend. Connor became only the fourth freshman in the history of Hauppauge Wrestling to qualify for the NYS Tournament.

Mikey placed second. He became Hauppauge's 15th finalist in the NYS tournament and finished his career with 116 wins placing him in the "Century Club" for wins in the Suffolk County history books. He was a two-time "NYS Placewinner" and a three-time "All-County" wrestler, and two-time Champion.


Frankie placed third. He has placed twice in the "Suffolk County Championships." He was 3rd this year but wrestled outstandingly in the "NYS Wrestling Tournament" defeating the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th 7th, and 8th seeded wrestlers.

Our Hauppauge team finished in 11th place out of the 135 teams represented in the "NYS Tournament" and was Suffolk County's highest placed team in the tournament.






FOREST BROOK STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN "RARE DISEASE DAY"







On Saturday April 9th the Hauppauge Youth and Community Alliance and Wellness Committee presents our annual Power of One Family Fun Run. All members of the Hauppauge School District community are invited to participate. Whether you wish to walk or run, the 5K course is open to residents of all ages who would like to participate. All proceeds will benefit P.O.W.E.R. Scholarships for our HS seniors. The run begins at 8:30 a.m. in front of Hauppauge Middle School and will proceed through the streets of Hauppauge. Official times will be recorded for all participants. Awards will be presented to the top three male and female runners in each of the following age groups:

12 and under, 13-15, 16-19, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, and 60+.

We will also have a one mile fun run on the grounds of the Middle School at 8:00 a.m. Each participant will receive a fun run certificate to celebrate their accomplishment.
