# "HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION 2022" DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI SPEAKER IS PAUL MONUSKY OF THE CLASS OF 1997

Each year Hauppauge High School hosts a "Distinguished Alumni" Speaker. This year, we are proud to announce that Paul Monusky of the Class of 1997 will speak at this year's Class of 2022 Graduation.

Paul Monusky is an 11 Time EMMY Winning Senior Producer/Director for NFL FILMS who graduated Hauppauge High School in 1997.

Paul Monusky grew up in the "Bird Section" of Hauppauge and attended Pines Elementary and Hauppauge Middle School. It was at Hauppauge High School that he began his love of Television and Sports Broadcasting creating the "Monusky Minute," a daily sports report during the morning announcements. He also began taking TV Production classes with Mr. Fran DePetris and ended up spending most of his time learning how to edit and create Football highlight films. Mr.



Monusky's first NFL movies were made during his free time at Hauppauge High School in that TV Production room, and it is where he laid the groundwork he would need to become one of the industry's premiere sports documentarians. He was also the Editor-In-Chief of the School Newspaper, was awarded "Mr. Hauppauge," earned Varsity letters on the Golf team and was a Quarterback on the Varsity Football team who had more career interceptions (1), than passing Touchdowns (0).


After leaving Hauppauge High School, Mr. Monusky wanted to be a Sports Broadcaster, and he received a degree in Journalism from the University of Maryland. At College Park, he was a member of the Student Radio Station, and did play-by-play and color commentary for the University of Maryland's soccer, baseball, basketball, and football teams. He gained National Recognition for his radio call

of Marshall McDougal's 7 Home Run game and announced a Final Four.

Since graduation, Mr. Monusky has worked for TNT, ESPN, ABC Sports, NBC Sports, and the USGA. For the past 15 years he has been an Emmy Award winning Producer/Editor/Director at NFL FILMS. He has worked on and attended 10 Super Bowls, 6 Pro Bowls, and 5 NFL Drafts. He has interviewed some of the most prolific athletes and entertainers in the world, including Michael Jordan, Tom Brady, Joe Montana, Emmitt Smith, Barry Sanders, Jack Nicklaus, Steph Curry, Method Man and Ronda Rousey.

Paul specializes in longer form documentaries and has directed and produced films on some of the greatest NFL players and coaches, including Emmitt Smith, Barry Sanders, Pat Tillman, Jerry Rice, Terrell Owens and Thurman Thomas. He also helped produce the ESPN "30 for 30" Film, and "The Two Bills" on Bill Belichick and Bill Parcells. He was the Show Head on the Emmy Award Winning "NFL 100 Greatest" series and most recently "Rowdy's Places" on ESPN+. His work and interviews have been seen by millions of people. The impressions on social media for the "NFL 100 Greatest" Series alone reached over 75 million views.





# "2022 Distinguished Alumni Q & A"

We wanted to know more about Paul Monusky, Class of 1997, and the time he spent here in the Hauppauge School District. He was happy to participate in a little "Q & A."

#### What is your most lasting memory of Hauppauge High School?

I have some great memories at Hauppauge High School, from winning "Mr. Hauppauge", to 'acting' in the school plays, to the morning announcements and "The Monusky Minute." My favorite memories, however, were playing football. I was the backup Quarterback for a team that won one game in two years, and it still was one of the best experiences of my life.

Which teacher had the most impact on you at Hauppauge High School that you still think about today? I had some great teachers at Hauppauge High School. The one who made the biggest impact on me was my TV Production Teacher, Fran DePetris. What started as just a class to take, turned into a lifelong obsession and profession. Mr. DePetris taught me the first things about TV Production and editing and sparked my interest in visual storytelling. He made the TV Production room a very fun place to be for me, and I really enjoyed it.

#### What was your first paying job as a teenager?

I delivered Newsday on my bicycle. My brother had the job first, and then we did it together. I delivered papers everyday through my part of the Bird section.

#### What did you do for fun when you lived here?

We had a fun block with a lot of kids in my neighborhood. I have great memories of playing wiffle ball, street football, street hockey and basketball. When I got older, I loved going to Commack Cinemas to watch movies.

#### What motivates you every day?

Every day I am motivated by my family. There is not a moment that goes by when I am not thinking about my daughters, Payton and Quinn and my wife, Kim, and now our new dog, Oakley. I do want to set a positive example for them, but I also try to be the best person I can be. I also try to constantly evolve to be the best version of myself.

#### What one word would you use to describe yourself?

Passionate. No matter what I try to do, whether it's working, coaching, playing sports, watching the Jets and Rangers, or even playing Fortnite with my kids, I try to do it as passionately as I can. I had the absolute honor of producing and directing a documentary on Pat Tillman, and he had a great quote "If you are not passionate about doing something, then don't do it." That has stuck with me and drives me every day.

#### Do you have a favorite quote?

"Hard Work beats Talent when Talent doesn't Work." I saw this written on a dry erase board in Coach Keenan McCardell's office when I was filming a documentary on him. It really resonated with me and continues to this day. There is always going to be someone bigger, faster, stronger or smarter than you, so you can't rely on just your God given abilities. But if you have a relentless work ethic, you can accomplish anything. My other favorite, is Bill Belichick's "Do Your Job." It's definitely become a cliche and it's not a long quote, but it perfectly encapsulates what I want to accomplish in many situations. Do what I need to do, what's best for my family or my team, and don't worry about what anybody else is doing.

# You have done so many interesting things in your life. Is there something you would still like to accomplish?



I've had a wonderful career so far, and still get to challenge myself professionally and creatively by making documentary films and shows about the sport I've loved since I was a boy. 
# "2022 Distinguished Alumni Q & A"

We are thrilled to announce that at the 2022 Butch Dellecave Awards Ceremony, honoring the top student-athletes in Suffolk County, Hauppauge was extremely well represented. This prestigious award is presented annually to the top female and male Suffolk County student-athletes who demonstrate excellence in athletics, academics and community service.

The Hauppauge Nominees for the Award were Seniors Bella Salvia, Volleyball and Softball, and Jake Nielsen, Swimming and Cross Country, who were chosen as Hauppauge's top student-athletes. Bella and Jake attended the ceremony this past Sunday at Villa Lombardi's along with the award winners from 51 other schools in Suffolk County. The list was then pared down to a group of finalists and both Jake and Bella were chosen for this prestigious distinction of being Dellecave Finalists.

When the winners were announced, it was Hauppauge's Jake Nielsen who was named the "2022 Recipient of the Butch Dellecave Award" as the Top Male Student-Athlete in Suffolk County. Jake had an outstanding senior season as a member of the Hauppauge Swim Team, culminating in being crowned New York State Champion in the 50 Freestyle and being named Newsday's Long Island Swimmer of the Year. Jake is Hauppauge's first recipient since 2017 when Katie Murphy was selected as the winner.

Congratulations to both Jake and Bella on outstanding high school careers and on receiving these prestigious honors. We can not thank them enough for the way they have represented the Hauppauge Athletic Department, school, and community, and for the example and standard they have set for those who will follow in their footsteps. 

Club members also painted a mural to remind all...It's Cool to Be Kind!




















# BRETTON WOODS WELCOMES INCOMING KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS FOR AN ORIENTATION


