





These students' projects were then selected to be entered at the Brookhaven National Laboratory. The goal of the Science Fair is to generate an interest in and excitement about science and engineering for all ages. This contest provides an opportunity for students to showcase their projects to peers and judging teams consisting of Brookhaven National Laboratory scientific and engineering staff and elementary school teachers. Students gain experience using science and engineering practices, as well as the scientific method or engineering design process.


BRETTON WOODS PTA HOSTS INAUGURAL "DESSERT DAY" FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF
