MIDDLE SCHOOL CODERS PARTICIPATE IN "CODE/CLASH - INNER DISTRICT HACKATHON"

Hauppauge Middle School Coders participated in a "Code/Clash - Inner District Hackathon" on Tuesday, November 22nd. This competition is much like the "Long Island Inter-District Hackathon." It is run by kidOYO where students compete in teams of 10 to take over a map in a game similar to "Risk."

To earn territories on the map, students need to submit programs in coding languages such as Python, Hatch, or Sprite Editor that meet challenge requirements specific to that territory. The best program that meets the requirements earns the territory and points in the game for that team. The team with the most points at the end of the 2-hour event wins the game.

The winning team was the Yellow Team, "Bananers!" They are the winners of the inaugural "Gordon Cup" and will be receiving tshirts, special 3D printed "golden badges," and their name on the Gordon Cup Trophy that will be kept in a showcase in the S Hallway of HMS.

This is the first year of the yearly event meant to showcase the coding talents of Hauppauge Middle School and inspire new coders to join in the fun.




















FOREST BROOK FIRST-GRADERS PUT ON "A THANKSGIVING SHOW"


