HIGH SCHOOL DRAMA PRESENTS "26 PEBBLES"

On Friday and Saturday, October 21st and 22nd, the High School Drama students presented "26 Pebbles." The play "26 Pebbles" by Eric Ulloa is the story of the Sandy Hook community. Through the lens of tragedy, they learned about the importance of resilience, compassion, kindness and understanding. This drama is directly related to a social and emotional initiative which the Hauppauge School District rolled out exactly one year ago. Last September, Scarlett Lewis, a Sandy Hook mom who lost her son, spoke at Superintendent's Conference Day to the entire Hauppauge faculty. Lewis created the "Choose Love Movement" and through a formula of courage, gratitude, forgiveness, and compassion in action has designed a movement developing safer and more loving communities.

Our young actors had the opportunity of going through an immersive experience to bring truth and a meaningful production to the stage. These students actually met Scarlett Lewis and held conversations with her allowing them to research the community. They became familiar with the victims and families of Sandy Hook, and together our students created a community of their own on the stage.

"26 Pebbles" is representative of how each of the victims lost have created a ripple effect as the rest of the world came together to support them. As these students honored this town through their production, the experience brought them to realize their own gratitude about the importance of our own supportive and loving Hauppauge community.






FOREST BROOK STUDENTS AND STAFF CELEBRATE "DOWN SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH"
