


### WELCOME HOME, MARINE! PFC EIAN CREAN, CLASS OF 2022, IS HOME FOR CHRISTMAS


Our High School welcomed back one of our graduates of the Class of 2022 on Tuesday, December 20th. Private First Class, Eian Crean, of the U.S. Marines, came to the high school with several recruiters and enjoyed a special visit with staff and students.

Eian Crean has now completed both Recruit Training aboard Paris Island South Carolina, and Marine Combat Training aboard Camp Geiger, North Carolina. From this training he has gained skills in small unit leadership, marksmanship, land navigation, field craft, and close order drill. Eian's next step will be his Military Occupation Specialty School aboard Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, where he will begin his formal training to become a Combat Engineer. The duties of a Combat Engineer are to construct bridges, clear obstructions via demolition, and the detection of mines and other environmental hazards.
