What was your major, and are you working in that field today?

Yes I am working in the field of education. I was a teacher, coach, and I am currently the Director of Social Studies and Business, Coordinator and Head Instructor of the Hauppauge Swim Program. I have a BA: Secondary Education/History - George Washington University and MSEd: Fordham University, Graduate Certificate in Education Leadership: State University of NY Stony Brook.

What was your favorite and least favorite thing about school?

Favorite: I really liked learning and I was on the swim team. Junior - Senior week where the juniors and seniors competed in academic and athletic events. Least favorite: Wearing the band uniform.

Which teacher had the most impact on you at Hauppauge High School that you still think about today?

I was so lucky to have many teachers that influenced me. Russ Steyert was a social studies teacher and he made me think in a different way, and to love history. Not just US History, but all history. Vic Goldie, an English teacher I had in 10th and 12 grade, really made me enjoy writing. Ron Bellucci was my coach and he inspired me to do better.

What was your hardest class?

Physics hands down. I didn't want to take it but my mother forced me.

What schools did you attend in Hauppauge and what is your fondest memory of going to school here?

In Kindergarten through sixth, I was at Pines Elementary. In seventh grade, Hauppauge Middle School (construction was going on in the MS). In grades eight through twelve I was at Hauppauge High School.

My fondest memory is the sense of community. There is no downtown in Hauppauge, and the schools were and continue to be everything. We used to have July 4th fireworks at the high school. I also loved swimming as a competitive swimmer and working in the swim program. Ron Bellucci was the first male coach of a girls team at Hauppauge and for him to coach, a parent had to volunteer to go on the bus and be in the locker room. My mother, Maureen Bates, did this for the entire season.

What did you do for fun when you were in high school?

Swimming, being with my friends, going to the movies, and roller skating at the Commack Roller Rink. I began working in the swim program when I was in high school, and I have continued working there for over 40 years. I became the Coordinator of the District Swim Program in 1987.

What motivates you every day and do you have a favorite quote?

Seeing students succeed, working with my staff, seeing the growth in my teachers, working collaboratively with other administrators.

How do you like to spend your free time?

Being with my family and friends, camping, riding my electric bike, and reading.

Why did you choose to remain in Hauppauge?

I was living in Washington DC. I worked in the swim program at Hauppauge since I was in high school and I came home to work and decided to stay. Best decision!




