
THE HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE OLYMPIAD TEAM IS GOING TO THE STATES!

"SPOTLIGHT"... COURAGE, GRATITUDE, FORGIVENESS, AND COMPASSION MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE RECOGNIZED IN STUDENT APPRECIATION PROGRAM

Although achieving high marks and attaining good grades are a most important aspect of middle school and are worthy of recognition, it is not the only aspect of middle school that is deemed as important and worthy of acknowledgment. "Spotlight" is the student appreciation program that Hauppauge Middle School has developed in order to recognize those students who have displayed social emotional literacy skills. Hauppauge Middle School recognizes students each month who have exhibited acts of Courage, Gratitude, Forgiveness and Compassion.

The "Spotlight" recognition program is based on the "Jesse Lewis - Choose Love Movement" which has been adopted by Hauppauge School District and is being taught in over 10,000 schools, in all 50 states, and over 120 countries, serving over three million children globally. The Choose Love Movement is an organization with a mission to create safer and more loving communities through no cost Character Social Emotional Development programs (CSED) that are suited for all stages of life. At the core of it all is a simple formula (COURAGE + GRATITUDE + FORGIVENESS + COMPASSION-IN-ACTION = Choosing Love) that anyone can learn and practice to nourish and strengthen the body, mind, and emotions to cultivate happy, healthy, meaningful lives and to thoughtfully respond to all we meet and improve the world around us.

Each month, the staff at Hauppauge Middle School is on the lookout for those students who have displayed the core elements of Choose Love whether it be in the classroom, hallways or cafeteria and will nominate those students and honor them at a monthly award ceremony. The ceremony is recorded as it is conducted within the library and then broadcast to the entire school during the advisory period. These students deserve to be recognized in front of the entire student body which the video being presented during advisory allows. The students receive a certificate as well as a laptop sticker at the ceremony.

At Hauppauge Middle School we always want to be practicing essential life skills such as relationship building, emotional management and coping strategies, for these skills cultivate and foster a sense of security. In turn, this creates a connected and compassionate environment. When students feel a sense of belonging and psychological safety, they are happier, more well-adjusted and more successful. 


PINES ELEMENTARY STUDENTS ARE THINKING ABOUT THEIR COLLEGE AND CAREER FUTURES





















































