

# HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR WOWS HIS TEACHERS AND CLASSMATES AFTER MAKING HIS OWN GUITAR


High School Senior, Chris Diesso, is a student in Mr. Dowd's Materials Processing class at the high school, which takes place in the new STEM Lab. He has completed his project of making his own new, vintage, "Les Paul Guitar." The guitar was made using the plans and specifications of a vintage "Les Paul Guitar."

Chris Diesso said the following regarding his amazing project, "The experience was definitely challenging because there was a lot of trial and error. Building a guitar is meticulous work. I spent a month on hand sanding alone. But, as far as the machine goes, once we got all of our measurements it was smooth sailing from there. The only thing after that was the very detailed hand work. I enjoyed every second of it."

Chris cut the guitar out of wood after using a foam prototype. He then assembled the guitar with the necessary hardware.

The ribbon-cutting for the new STEM Lab at the high school took place on Tuesday, December 13th, 2023. The teachers have use of a CNC machine, wood laser cutters, Venus Plasma Cutter, and 3-D printers. The students are making the most of this equipment and creating amazing things!





# HIGH SCHOOL INTERACT CLUB STUDENTS SUPPORT THE EAGLE FOOD PANTRY



# ROBOTICS CLUB TEAM #358 COMPETES IN "FIRST ROBOTICS COMPETITION"

The Hauppauge Robotics Team successfully built a robot to compete at the FIRST Robotics Competition at Hofstra University this past weekend. The next competition will take place at the MVP Arena in Albany, and the competition will be able to be seen on Twitch.

The FIRST Robotics Competition as described on their website, "is a high school level robotics competition where students experience first-hand the miracles that a career in science and technology can produce. The unique part of this program is that students are expected to work hand-in-hand with professional engineer volunteers to design and build in six weeks, a robot about the size and weight of a high school student (up to 150 lb & 5 feet tall) to play a game that changes every year. This is a challenge for both student and engineer creativity."

Teams are formed in the Fall with an annual game Kickoff the first weekend in January starting the six-week design & build. Competitions of 40 to 70 robots take place in March and April in arenas across North America, and in Israel capped by a double championship event involving 600 teams each.




