ELEMENTARY STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN "UPPER ELEMENTARY CODE CONQUEST HACKATHON"

"Code Conquest" is an original hackathon community, game, and event structure, that introduces young coders to creative computing challenges in team-based competitions enabled with the Code Conquest app by KidOYO.

For the first time, Hauppauge Elementary STEAM teachers, Mrs. Pecoraro, Mrs. Bullaro, and Mr. Gibson brought a team to the "Upper Elementary Code Conquest Hackathon," which took place at Willets Road School in



East Williston on May 5th. The students were chosen from all three of our elementary schools based on how many coding badges they earned independently on the KidOYO platform after learning the basics in STEAM this year. While our team did not win the competition, we could not have been more proud of their displays of work ethic, determination, and cooperation. They worked so well together, made new friends and are already planning on continuing their efforts next year.



The Pines Advanced Orchestra has been hard at work preparing for their concert. On Friday, May 5th, they had a special opportunity to meet the composer of their favorite piece!

Eric Davis, a local composer, met with the Advanced Orchestra and worked with them on the piece he wrote called "Spy Rock." After the group performed for him, he took the baton and worked with the students on the melody and style of the piece. He shared how he wrote the piece and how he came up with the title.

After practicing, the students had an opportunity to ask questions on what it is like to be a composer. "How do you come up with a song?" asked Vincent Arroyo, fifth-grade bass student. Mr. Davis responded, "I will play a melody and then record it on a voice memo. Then I won't listen to it for a few days. When I listen again, I add on to the melody. After a few weeks, the piece will grow."

Fifth-grade violist Ella Muilenburg asked "How do you get published? Have you been rejected?" Eric shared, "I will submit a piece to many publishers. Sometimes I will hear back within a week, sometimes not for months. If I get rejected, I will submit to another publisher. In fact, a piece that will be published at the end of this year was rejected by six publishers." Bo Langlois, fourth-grade violin student then added, "Well it's lucky number 7!"

Working with Eric was an amazing experience for all the students. "It was fun working with Eric and improving our musical skills," said Adriana Andrzejczyk, fifth-grade cello student.





BRETTON WOODS FORENSICS CLUB WELCOMES GUEST SPEAKER




