
"HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION 2022" OUR DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI SPEAKER IS OUR OWN, DOREEN GORDON, OF THE CLASS OF 1980

Each year Hauppauge High School hosts a "Distinguished Alumni" speaker. This year, we are proud to announce that Doreen Gordon, Class of 1980 graduate, and Director of Social Studies and Business, will speak at this year's Class of 2023 Graduation.

Doreen Gordon is currently the Director of Social Studies and Business for the Hauppauge School District, the Coordinator of the Hauppauge District Swim Program, and the President of HAAP (Hauppauge Association of Administrative Personnel). She is a proud graduate of the Class of 1980.

Mrs. Gordon grew up in the Pines and attended Pines Elementary School from Kindergarten through 6th grade, Hauppauge Middle School for 7th grade (the Middle School was undergoing construction so it only housed 7th grade and half of 8th grade), and grades 8th-12th in the high school. At this time Hauppauge had five elementary schools, one mid-





dle and one high school. The graduating class of 1980 had close to 600 graduates and was considered the smallest in the high school at that time. A highlight of the school year was the junior/senior week where the two classes competed in athletic and academic competitions to see which class was the best in the school.

Mrs. Gordon's love of history began when she was growing up and her father, John Bates, would tell stories about all of the places they went. She was lucky to have visited many historical sites with her father, John, her mother, Maureen, and siblings, also Hauppauge graduates, Patti and Johnny. This love of history and learning was fostered in high school with so many inspirational teachers. She was fortunate to have been taught by Russ Steyert and Tom Arnold. She later worked with Noel Gish, Carolyn Bogart, Barbara McCuster, and the rest of the social studies department and learned many valuable lessons. During high school, Mrs. Gordon was a member of the Varsity Swim/Dive Team and was captain in her last two years. She was an All-County and All-State swimmer, and credits her coach, Ron Bellucci, for pushing and encouraging her. Later, she enjoyed working alongside him when



he was her assistant coach. Additionally, she was involved in the class of 1980 and was secretary of the National Honor Society. Mrs. Gordon also swam for the Hauppauge Sea Eagles swim team. In 1979 she began working for the District Swim Program.

After graduation, Mrs. Gordon attended George Washington University on an athletic scholarship. As a person who loves history, being in Washington DC during this time was an amazing experience. Ronald Reagan and Jim Brady were shot, Iranian hostages came home, a plane crashed into the 14th Street Bridge, a Presidential Inauguration, and so many more

events. She graduated with a degree in social studies education and went on to complete her Master's degree at Fordham University in Lincoln Center.

After graduation, Mrs. Gordon worked in an elementary and middle school in the Shoreham Wading River school district in the computer lab as a teaching assistant. She continued to work in the Hauppauge swim program. She also worked in the Connetquot district as a substitute teacher. During this time she married Brian, and had two daughters, Megan and Kristen. She was hired as the Girl's Varsity and Middle School Swim/Dive coach at Hauppauge and continued in this role for 12 years.


Mrs. Gordon was hired as a social studies teacher at Hauppauge HS. It was an opportunity to work with some of the teachers she had in high school and to be inspired by their dedication to teaching and history. In 2003, she was inducted into the inaugural class of the Hauppauge Athletic Hall of Fame. Along with Ms. Cono, Mrs. Gordon brought the AP World History program to Hauppauge. It was exciting to work on this project and also a bit overwhelming. Luckily they were able to "borrow" material from her daughters to help them along the way.

Her husband, Brian, encouraged her to work on her administrative certificate from Stony Brook University. After several years in the department, Mrs. Gordon applied to be the social studies administrator at Hauppauge. She has served in the position of Director of Social Studies and Business for 15 years.



Mrs. Gordon has enjoyed the challenge of the job and is very proud of both departments' numerous accomplishments. The teachers are truly hardworking and dedicated professionals that always put students first, Hauppauge is lucky to have them. In 2016 Mrs. Gordon was recognized as Long Island's Outstanding Social Studies Supervisor. She was nominated by the middle and high school social studies department. It was an exceptional honor and was made even more special by the entire department being a part of it. In 2017, she was presented with the New York State Social Studies Supervisory Association Outstanding Social Studies Supervisor Award. She currently serves as the president of the administrative bargaining unit (HAAP), and the Co-President of the Long Island Council for Social Studies (LICSS). She was selected to serve on the NYSED Curriculum Council for Social Studies and had shared her expertise through various presentations and conferences. Mrs. Gordon still works in the swim program because she loves swimming and teaching. She feels blessed to have attended Hauppauge and is forever grateful for the opportunities it has provided her and her family.

Mrs. Gordon resides in Smithtown with her husband Brian. Her daughter Megan, a social studies educator, lives in Texas with her husband Loren, and her daughter Kristen, a CFO, lives in Connecticut. Here are some photos of Doreen through the years!

















































HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS "TAKE A WALK BACK IN TIME"












HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS EARN "THE NEW YORK STATE SEAL OF CIVIC READINESS"

BRETTON WOODS KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION


On Friday, June 9th, Bretton Woods held an orientation for all of our incoming Kindergartners who will be joining us here at Bretton Woods in September.
