HAUPPAUGE SCHOOLS WELCOME NEW STAFF


A new school year has begun, and while we welcome our students back, we also welcome our new staff members. Hauppauge has many new faces in their school buildings.

Katherine Fredriksen is a new Special Education teacher at Forest Brook. Katherine is from Bethesda, Maryland, and currently lives in





Thank you to the Bretton Woods PTA! You are very much appreciated. Here are some photos from this special day of help.


