



### SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY SOCIOLOGY PROFESSOR VISITS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS


Professor Sean Drake, Ph. D. from Syracuse University visited Hauppauge High School to speak with students in Ms. Surian's dual-enrollment college sociology course. The visit provided a unique opportunity for students to be exposed to college faculty and ask questions pertaining to the coursework and what to expect in college.

Professor Drake spent the period talking about his journey from undergraduate to graduate school, from Stanford University to Syracuse University. The discussion focused on C. Wright Mills' theory of "sociological imagination," noting that, "we are always a part of something larger than ourselves."

He also gave the students advice on freshman year and ways to make the most of their college experience such as going to professor's office hours, trying new classes, and more. The class ended with an enlightening question and answer session.


