## BRETTON WOODS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL RANKS SEVENTH IN “U.S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT - TOP TEN ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS IN SUFFOLK COUNTY”

“U.S. News & World Report” completed a ranking of elementary schools across the state and nation, using data from the U.S. Department of Education. Of the nearly 4,000 New York schools evaluated, a list of the top 10 schools for Suffolk County was created.

Bretton Woods Elementary School was ranked #7! According to the article “The methodology for the rankings focused on state assessments of students who were proficient or better in mathematics and reading/language arts. The study also accounted for student backgrounds, achievement in core subjects, and how well individual schools educate their students.” The article also stated, “Bretton Woods has a favorable 10:1 student-teacher ratio. The report indicated that 93 percent of the school’s 53 full-time teachers have three or more years of experience.”

Mr. Gagliardi, Principal at Bretton Woods, said the following, “Our teachers and staff always strive to provide the highest quality educational experience to our students in a supportive and caring environment. To be recognized by “U.S. News and World Report” among this esteemed group of Suffolk County elementary schools is truly an honor.”

## OUR BOARD OF EDUCATION TAKES PART IN A SPECIAL RETREAT, COMPLETE WITH A SPECIAL DINNER

On Tuesday, February 7th, our Board of Education came together before their meeting to enjoy some food, good company, and presentations by department directors.

Dr. Murphy supplied a delicious batch of homemade chili, Ms. Siena provided outstanding crockpot pork, Ms. Bilski cooked a tray of savory mac and cheese, while cornbread and other complimentary dishes to round out the feast was provided by Dr. McCarthy, Mr. Tasman and Dr. Smalley.

After dinner, Dr. Murphy and the Board reviewed yearly priorities and goals with a focus on Board Goal 1.2 "Prioritize Student Success." Dr. Murphy then invited his administrative colleagues to supply a deep dive into district data.

In their presentation, "Navigating the Data Landscape," our directors, and "District Data Team Co-Chairs," Dr. Kristen Reingold, Director of ELA and Reading; Dr. Robert Wankmuller, Director of Science and Research; Kelly Barry, Director of Social Studies and World Languages; and Meridyth Hansen, Director of Mathematics and Libraries; all spoke about the journey thus far as the appointed "architects" of the new District Data Team. They said that during their initial Data Team Meeting, they reviewed Board of Education Goals and the Hauppauge School District's Vision and Mission Statement. They then crafted a "Data Team Vision Statement" which read, "At Hauppauge School District our District Data Team is dedicated to empowering our educational community through the strategic collection, analysis, and utilization of data. We are committed to harnessing the power of data to drive continuous improvement, ensuring every student achieves their fullest potential." The presentation concluded with a Q&A with members of the Board of Education, and some reflection on "next steps" in using data to inform our district's philosophical approach going forward.

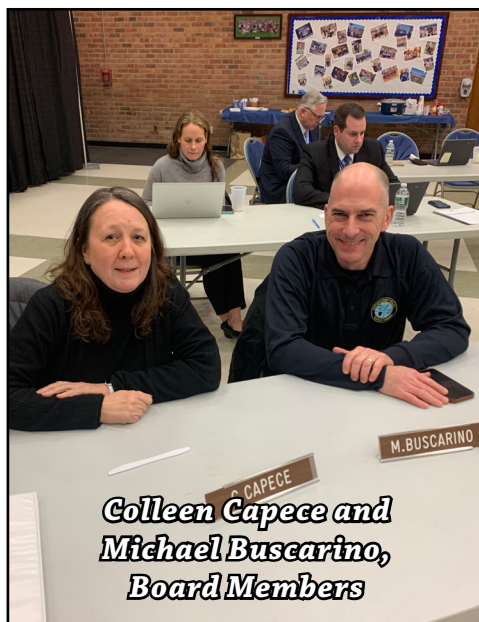

# HAUPPAUGE-SMITHTOWN BOYS SWIMMING AND DIVING TEAM WINS SECOND CONSECUTIVE “SUFFOLK COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP”

The 2024 Hauppauge-Smithtown Boys' Swimming & Diving Team won their 2nd consecutive “Suffolk County Championship” on Saturday, February 10th at Stony Brook University.

The undefeated champions scored 366 points defeating the next best team by 100 points. Hauppauge-Smithtown also set a new Suffolk County record in the 200 yard Freestyle relay with a time of 1:25.13, beating Half Hollow Hills' record set in 2017 of 1:25.37.

Top performers for Hauppauge were senior Colin Buscarino in diving. Colin finished as League 1 Champion and finished 2nd in the County Championship. Colin set a new Hauppauge 6 Dive (288.336) record on January 25th vs Brentwood-Bay Shore.

Sophomore Noah Hutzler finished 3rd in the 200 yard freestyle and 100 yard backstroke in the League 1 Championship. At the County Championship he finished 7th in the 200 yard freestyle 6th in the 100 yard backstroke. Noah will be part of the 400 freestyle relay at the NYSPHSAA Championship at Ithaca College on March 1-2.

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) National Science Bowl® is a nationwide academic competition that tests students' knowledge in all areas of science and mathematics. Middle and high school student teams from diverse backgrounds are composed of four students, one alternate, and a teacher who serves as an advisor and coach. These teams face-off in a fast-paced question-and-answer format. Teams are tested on a range of science disciplines including Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Physics, Energy, and Math.

This was the first time Hauppauge has participated in this prestigious science competition. Our team consisted of seniors: Sadiq Shaik, Elliot Tafla, Tommaso Clarke, and Israel Rojas, along with junior: Aayan Shah. The team was led by coach Carolyn Heck (Regents and AP Chemistry teacher, Quiz Bowl coach, Science Club and Science National Honor Society co-advisor). They took 5th place out of 30 teams from around Nassau and Suffolk counties and are looking forward to participating again in next year's tournament!

Did you know that In German culture health is a top priority. This field trip was a great way to stay healthy and relax our minds!



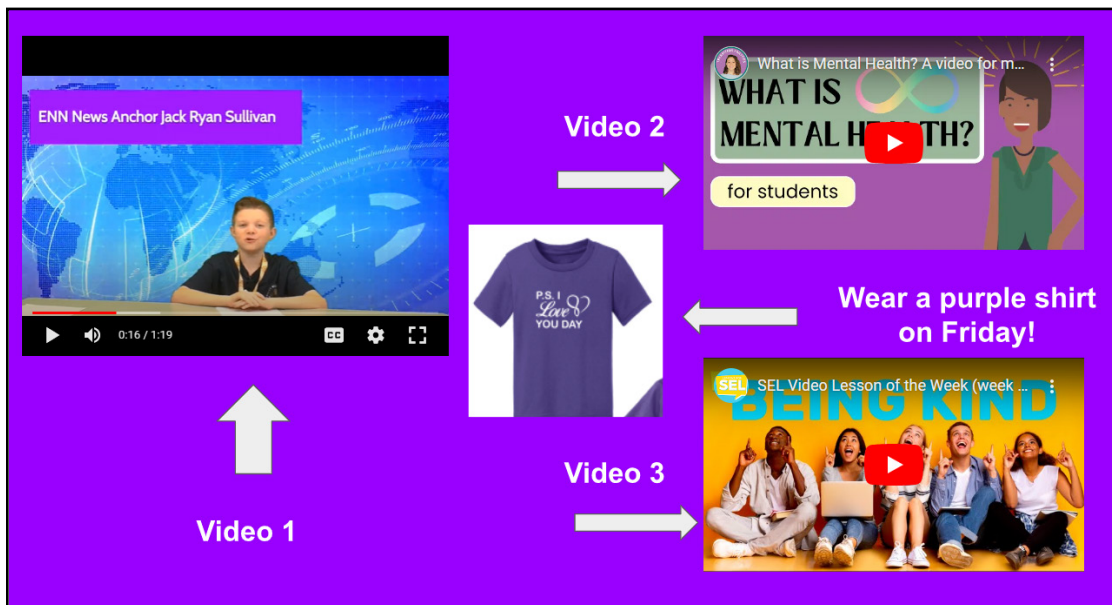


# MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS CELEBRATE “PS I LOVE YOU WEEK”

## UNIVERSAL PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

Dear Hauppauge Residents:

We would like to take this opportunity to inform you about our Universal Pre-Kindergarten (UPK) program. The UPK program is funded by a New York State grant. If the grant is awarded, the district will provide funding for the placement of a specified number of four-year-old children into the district-selected participating agencies/pre-school programs.

In anticipation of the 2024-2025 UPK grant, if you are interested in participating in the 2024-2025 Universal Pre-Kindergarten student lottery, please complete the UPK application form which may be accessed from the district's website at [www.hauppauge.k12.ny.us](http://www.hauppauge.k12.ny.us). You will find the information under the "Headlines and Happenings" section. In order to enter the lottery, all UPK applications must be received by Friday, March 22nd, 2024. The lottery will be held on Thursday, April 4th, 2024.

All children who reside in the Hauppauge Union Free School District and will be four years of age on or before December 1, 2024, are eligible to participate in the Universal Pre-Kindergarten lottery. If a child is five years of age on or before December 1, 2024, the child is not eligible to participate in the program.

The American Red Cross (ARC) has revised its swimming lessons to reflect the new trends, procedures, and philosophies in ARC swimming. Various safety and rescue skills, springboard diving, and competitive swim strokes and turns will now be incorporated into each course. The following pretests have been developed for each level: **Skills students must have prior to starting class. ALL swimmers will be tested on the first day for these skills.**

**Level I** Equivalent to Pre-beginner **Out of diapers, must be able to hold onto the wall throughout class, 1/2hr (crying & some fear is expected at this level).**

**Level II** Water adjustment skills **Must stand or hold onto the wall by themselves, can put their face in the water, can be in class without crying/fear.**

**Level III** **Swim 12 yards(width of pool) each independently, crawl stroke with rhythmic breathing, combined stroke on back, and back crawl.**

**Level IV** **Can swim length of pool (25 yards) proficiently in crawl stroke, backstroke, and 1/2-pool elementary backstroke with whip kick.**

**Level V** **Can swim multiple laps proficiently in Crawl stroke, Back Crawl, Elementary Backstroke, Sidestroke, Breaststroke & a lap of Butterfly kick, plus deep water skills.**

**Level VI Fitness- Proficient in swimming multiple laps of all Level 5 strokes including Butterfly stroke, with a focus on endurance and competitive swim skills.**

**Not offered this season-(Level VI Pre-Lifeguarding)**

Note: The main objective of all swimming classes is to teach students to swim effectively and efficiently. Instructors and aides utilize the ARC teaching progressions to achieve that desired result. ARC certificates are issued only if the student has satisfactorily mastered all required skills at his/her level of swimming. Repetition of various courses is not uncommon and is often encouraged in order for the student to develop confidence and endurance before going on to the next level. Keep in mind that the standard for satisfactory performance of any particular skill is set by the ARC.

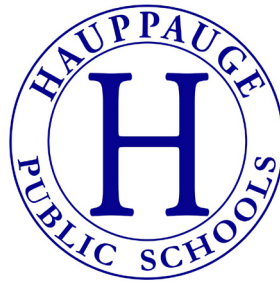
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
