HAUPPAUGE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION 2023

On Friday, June 23rd, the Class of 2023 shone brightly under cloudy skies at their Commencement Ceremony on the football field behind the high school. As the graduates waited to walk down to the field, their parents, siblings, relatives, and friends, took their seats. At 6:00 p.m. the ceremony began with "Pomp and Circumstance" ringing out as a sea of blue streamed down the field. The Class of 2023 was assembled together for the last time.

High School Principal, Joseph Wieckhorst, welcomed everyone and asked the class officers, Karli Connnolly, President; Olivia DiBenedetto, Vice President; Vincent Barbera and Ryan Capece, Public Relations; Anthony Palermo, Treasurer; and Bryana Sulinski, Secretary, to join him on the stage for the "Pledge of Allegiance." The High School Chamber Choir then performed "The National Anthem."

The class officers then presented the gift from the Class of 2023. Vice President, Olivia DiBenedetto, said, "The Hauppauge community has given us more than we could ever ask for. Not just an education, but memories we will never forget that we will tell to our children and grandchildren, life lessons that we've learned along the way, and friendships that will last a lifetime for many of us. As class officers, we wanted to make sure our last action as students was one that would give back to the community that has built us into the young adults we are today." Ryan Capece said, "This gift was a monetary donation to 'Defeat DIPG' which is a foundation that is of great significance to the Hauppauge Community. 'DIPG' is an extremely aggressive kind of brain tumor, which sadly has contributed to the loss of lively members of our Hauppauge family. This disease first impacted our community through the loss of Courtney Tomkin in 2008. Just this past year, an elementary student in the district passed from DIPG."



Principal Wieckhorst then addressed the graduates saying, "Over the last few weeks, maybe even longer than that, and over the next couple of months you'll do a lot of reflection and thinking back on the last 13 years of your life. All of that time in school has gotten you to this point, where you are now ready to be global citizens and make impacts on the world far greater than you can imagine. As you look back, and continue to look forward, my hope is that you'll feel a deep thankfulness and gratitude for all you have, all you've experienced, and the people in your lives."

Mr. Wieckhorst thanked the Board of Education members for their leadership and dedication to our district to make an event like this possible and said all are grateful for their time and commitment to the greatness of our District. Mr. Wieckhorst also thanked our Superintendent, Dr. Donald Murphy, and his team

Mr. Wieckhorst said, "Thank you for your support and affirmation. I am grateful to have all of you to look up to, and I'm so thankful you've entrusted me with leading this school."

Mr. Wieckhorst then thanked his colleagues, Assistant Principals, Andrea Darbee, Joy Ferrara, Kristy Pagliari and, Dan Wald. He said, "They really do so much for this school working crazy hours on things

often unseen. You are all incredible people, and I can't thank you enough for the support you give me, and what you've given to this graduating class. I'm grateful to have you in my life."

Mr. Wieckhorst thanked all those who work hard in our school district, Directors, Principals, Teachers, Counselors, Social Workers, Teaching Assistants, Clerical Support, Nurses, Facilities Team Members, Custodians, and Security. He also thanked the PTSA, led by Wendy Cavanagh this past year, which is her final year, and thanked her for her years of service.

Mr. Wieckhorst thanked the parents, guardians, families and friends of the Class of 2023 for their partnership through the years, and then thanked the graduates saying, "This is truly a one-of-a-kind class. Thank you for showing me in so many ways what I hope my own children will grow up to be. I can only hope as a father that they turn out to be like so many of you. I'd be forever grateful if that were to happen."

Mr. Wieckhorst closed his remarks saying, "Congratulations Class of 2023. My hope now is that you'll continue to show your greatness to the world, and you'll always remember to be grateful for all you have and accomplish, and all of the lessons you have learned here in Hauppauge. Start and end each day with gratitude, and you will find it makes such a difference in your life. Thank you."

Colleen Capece, a Board of Education Member, and mother of graduating senior, Ryan Capece, spoke and said in part, "As I look out, I can't help but think about the beginning of your Hauppauge journey. Do you recall that first day of kindergarten? You might have been a little nervous or maybe you were ex-





cited to finally go to school like your older siblings. I can assure you those first day jitters were not limited to you. I am certain there are many parents in attendance tonight who were like me. Nervous about how your day went, hoping you would make a few friends and eager for the bus to bring you safely home. However, another thing happened that day. On that first day, we made a promise to you. By we, I mean your parents and teachers, your coaches and club mentors, building staff and administrators, the Board of Education and the residents of our community. Salutatorian, Kaitlin Stephens, spoke and said in part, "This overwhelming feeling of pride is what connects us and commemorates this moment. Take a moment to remember what you are feeling right now because we all are going to share this moment forever. This is our time, our time to shine. This is it. We have arrived upon graduation day. Getting here has been a challenge








that our class accepted with grace and determination. We made it through a pandemic and distance learning, all while learning some essential skills along the way. I encourage you all to find your passion, your niche, and your place of belonging. I encourage you all to make new friends, travel to new places, and experience new things. I encourage you all to find your place in this world, and to find what makes you truly happy."

Valedictorian, Connor Leddy, who will be attending Hofstra University in the Fall, spoke next. Connor said in part, "We live in a new generation, that is to say we are in a growing world with growing population,

growing technology, growing economy, growing TikTok trends, and all of this means we have a lot more to account for. And due to our human nature, we like to do things fast, and this results in having a lot of work in a little amount of time. The goal of life should be to enjoy it. Unfortunately, however, I have a growing fear there will be more burnout and less time for enjoyment because of these new pressures. The truth is that as humans, we cannot do everything. It is easy to fall into the misconception that everything is possible instead of anything is possible. Enjoying yourself is a matter of focusing on what is important to you in life, what you want to achieve. Mr. Wieckhorst introduced the next speaker, Distinguished Alumni, Doreen Gordon, who graduated from Hauppauge High School in 1980, and returned to make a career here as a teacher, coach, and administrator, who retires on June 30th. Mrs. Gordon grew up in Hauppauge and attended Pines Elementary School from Kindergarten through 6th grade, Hauppauge Middle School for 7th grade (the Middle School was undergoing construction so it only housed 7th grade and half of 8th grade), and grades 8th -12th in the high school. Ms. Gordon said to the Class of 2023 in part, "I am overwhelmed at receiving this accolade and addressing the Class of 2023. Fifty-five years ago, I became part of the school and community. We are family who support each other. You are lucky to have such dedicated teachers in the Social Studies and Business Departments, and throughout all of your Hauppauge school years. You know you were cared for and have teachers and family to support you. You are the class who started in the high school during



a pandemic. But, you are here today as a testament to your perseverance. Appreciate the people you meet who impact your lives. Come back and share your experiences. Be passionate about what you want to do and know that you can always come home to your Hauppauge family."

The students filed up to the stage to receive their diplomas. After, Dr. Murphy recognized the Class of 2023 students who are entering the military; Thomas Fitzpatrick who will be entering the Navy, and Daniel Ward who will be entering the Marines. He thanked them for their service, and invited audience community members who are Active Military, Retired Military, Police, Firefighters, and First Responders, to stand and be recognized. Dr. Murphy said to the graduates, "Look around - you are surrounded by role models and heroes. This is your district, this is your community, this is your home!"



Finally, it was time for the Certification of the Class of 2023! Dr. Murphy, who was joined by Board of Education President, Dave Barshay, said, "It is my pleasure, on the authority granted to me as the Superintendent of Schools and by the Board of Regents of the State of New York, to certify the class of 2023 as graduates of Hauppauge High School. You may now move your tassel from the right side of your head to the left side. You have officially graduated. Congratulations!"
