The Hauppauge community is located 45 miles east of New York City and the District's fifteen square miles straddle the common boundary line of the Towns of Islip and Smithtown. The attractiveness of Hauppauge, in both convenience and natural beauty, has swelled the population of the area to more than 20,000. In addition to outstanding schools and residential neighborhoods, Hauppauge is home to the nation's second largest industrial park. The presence of robust and modern industry provides a healthy tax base from which the School District and its students directly benefit.

Hauppauge High School is a comprehensive senior high school and is the educational home to 1,239 students in grades 9-12. Hauppauge High School is accredited by the New York State Board of Regents. The class of 2018 had one National Merit Semi-finalist, four commended students, and two National Hispanic Recognition Program qualifiers.

Class rank is calculated in September of the senior year using a weighted GPA; courses are weighted based on degree of difficulty. A student must have completed a minimum of 15 credits to be in the senior class and included in the class rank. All high school credits earned are included, with the exception of physical education.

Hauppauge High School offers students many opportunities for academic advancement through IB, AP, honors, and concurrent college credit courses. Hauppauge became an International Baccalaureate World School in 2012. In only five years, the IB Program at Hauppauge has grown in participation and performance.

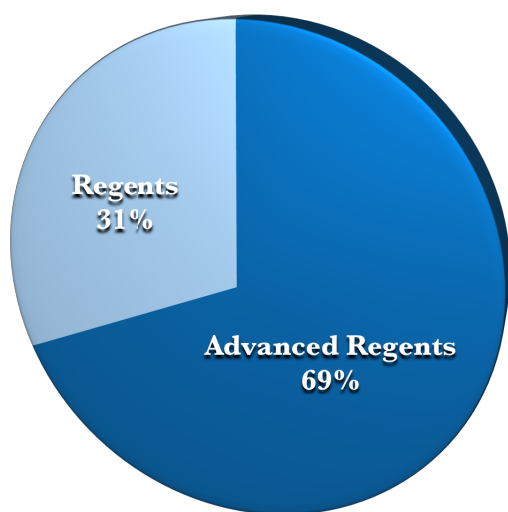

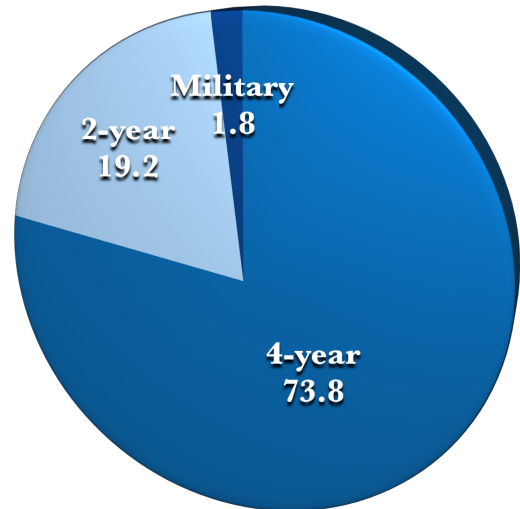
