Hauppauge High School is a comprehensive senior high school (grades 9-12) attended by 1205 students and accredited by the New York State Education Department. The enrollment for the class of 2017 is 297 with 286 students ranked. In 2016, there were 3 National Merit Commended students and 1 National Merit Semifinalist.

The graduating class of 2016 consisted of 305 seniors, 97% continued to higher education; 71% to 4-year colleges, 26% to 2-year colleges. The mean SAT score for the Class of 2016 was Critical Reading – 518, Math – 546, Writing - 513. Statewide, the mean SAT scores were: Critical Reading - 489, Math - 501, Writing - 477. There were 89 AP Scholars identified in 2016, with 4 recognized as National AP Scholars.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Program

In May of 2012, Hauppauge High School became an International Baccalaureate World School. There are currently 119 seniors enrolled in IB courses with 31 enrolled in the Diploma Program.

Graduation Requirements

All students of Hauppauge High School are expected to complete courses at the Regents level or beyond as required by the New York State Department of Education. This includes four years of English and social studies, along with three years of mathematics and science. The typical four year sequence includes required credits in physical education, business, technology, art, music and the elective courses. A minimum of five Regents examinations must be successfully passed (Global History, U.S. History, Algebra I, English, and Science) to earn a Regents diploma. Successful completion of a minimum of eight Regents exams are required for a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation.

Class Rank

Class rank is calculated in September of the senior year using a weighted GPA. Each course is assigned a specific level that relates to its degree of difficulty. A student must have completed a minimum of 15 credits to be in the senior class and included in the class rank. All credits earned by a student at Hauppauge High School or another accredited institution from the time that the pupil enters eighth grade are included, with the exception of physical education, provided an official transcript is received by the counseling center.

Comprehensive Curriculum

Hauppauge High School offers a variety of academic opportunities including: 17 AP courses, 19 IB courses, 10 college courses, honors level courses in all academic and some elective areas, three second languages, a comprehensive arts academy, strong music and broadcasting program, full continuum of special education services, and a generous selection of elective courses.
