- Collect, analyze, and use formative assessment data to inform timely decisions about what happens next for students' learning
- Strengthen cultural proficiency in instruction, curriculum, class climate, and school environment

FORMAT

- Course schedules are designed to balance in-class learning and reflection with out-of-class application.
- Course readings draw upon the course text, *The Skillful Teacher: Building Your Teaching Skills* (2009), and current professional articles.
- Course assignments, of which there are three, strengthen participants' capacities in the areas of planning, teaching, and reflecting.
- Participants are expected to come prepared to each session having completed course readings and assignments and ready to engage in critical thinking and dialogue with fellow educators.
